A. Touch-a-Truck Huge Success

The first South Fayette Touch-a-Truck event was more successful than expected. On Sunday, July 24, more than 1,000 people were estimated in attendance. About 400 pink and yellow construction hats were handed out for free to kids of all ages. Around 30 vehicles and organizations participated, including a South Fayette Township police vehicle, South Bridge EMS ambulance, Waste Management truck, Port Authority bus, Bioni drilling vehicle and cement truck, Xtreme Trucks monster truck, and Campbell Farm equipment. Also present were several fire vehicles from all four volunteer fire departments: South Fayette, Fairview, Sturgeon, and Oak Ridge, which were a great hit with the kids. Multiple volunteer fire staff interacted with the public and assisted children in and out of the trucks. Special thanks goes to South Fayette Public Works, who assisted with planning, setting up, cleaning up and providing seven township vehicles to display. Those vehicles included a street sweeper, dump truck, skid loader, and more. Without their help, this event would not have been possible. We would like to specifically thank Butch Truitt, Nick Nicholas, Mark Mitchell, and Dan Dernosek for all of their time and dedication put into this event. Summer Recreation Intern, Danielle Kirker, was given responsibility in planning and operating the event.
