We responded to twenty-three (23) calls this month including four motor vehicle accidents, one fire alarm, two carbon monoxide alarms, and two wires down calls in our primary response area. We also provided mutual assistance to South Fayette (Cuddy) VFD for two possible structure fires, one brush fire, and one outside fire, Sturgeon VFD for two motor vehicle accidents, Fairview VFD for two possible structure fires, one smoke odor, one gas odor, one motor vehicle accident, and one carbon monoxide alarm, Bridgeville VFD for one standby while they assisted a neighboring department, and Oakdale VFD for one possible structure fire.

Additional Activities

The volunteers at Oak Ridge VFD dedicate numerous additional hours beyond responding to calls for service. Weekly training exercises, equipment checks, various cleaning and maintenance activities, additional training opportunities, as well as numerous other activities occur on a regular basis.
