We responded to eight (8) calls this month including a possible gas odor and a water condition in our primary response area. We also provided mutual assistance to South Fayette VFD (Cuddy) for a structure fire and a fire alarm, Fairview VFD for two possible structure fires, North Fayette VFD for a possible structure fire, and Bridgeville VFD for a standby while they responded to a structure fire in their jurisdiction.

Additional Activities

The volunteers at Oak Ridge VFD dedicate numerous additional hours beyond responding to calls for service. Weekly training exercises, equipment checks, various cleaning and maintenance activities, additional training opportunities, as well as numerous other activities occur on a regular basis.

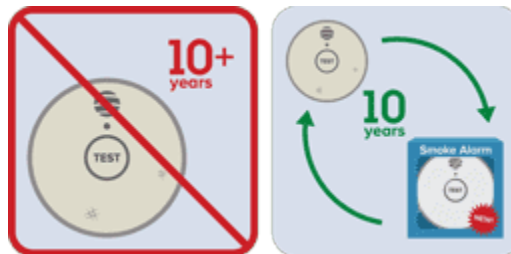
Additional Comments:

Daylight Saving Time started on March 8th. Twice a year when you change your clocks take the time to change your smoke detector batteries and test their operation too!

- You should have one smoke detector on each floor of your home.
- For the best protection ensure you have smoke detectors outside AND inside each sleeping area.



- Detectors that are interconnected (if one alarms they all alarm) are best to ensure you are alerted to a problem anywhere in your home.
- Smoke detectors manufactured before 2015 should be replaced.



- Don't forget to replace batteries in your CO detectors and check them too!

As Spring begins please remember burning of yard waste, and most other materials, is prohibited in Allegheny County year round. No material other than clean wood, propane or natural gas may be open burned EXCEPT for:

- Commercially available fire logs, paraffin logs or wood pellets
- Paper or commercial smokeless fire starters in order to start a fire
- Charcoal for the preparation of food only
